#### MISSION IMPOSSIBLE? NO! "MISSION TRACKER" TAKES OFF

Mission Tracker." Today, we're proud to inform you that our staff and the program planning committee have implemented this new software program!

The process of intake assessments – which enables us to know and track our homeless guests – was very cumbersome and inefficient. Now, case notes for a guest can be entered and seen by staff members who are authorized to see them, making our work more efficient and collaborative. The Shelter's board approved the purchase of our new software during last summer. In the months ahead, another software module named, "Volunteer Tracker" will also be launched. This will let us manage in-house projects and improve the way we work with volunteers.

Our journey from a paper system to an electronic system taught us many lessons. We learned that this project was not about simply launching a new software, but a journey towards being more effective and transparent in ministering to our guests. Guest information will be utilized to link them to resources, and to improve their independence and stability. We will benefit from having improved insights about where a specific guest is succeeding or struggling, and when to intervene. Leadership will be able to evaluate the individual impact being made, and identify any gaps in services that demand staff action/intervention.

#### **CHILD MENTORING PROGRAM**

In our main office, you will find an occupancy board listing rooms as dormitory or family, with the number of men, women, and children residing in each. On a recent visit, the board reports that we served 21 children, 23 women, and 16 men during the previous night. God provided a warm place to sleep, nutritious meals, and a safe place to stay for these fortunate 60. In previous newsletters, we have written about the growing number of homeless children who come from chaotic situations created by the loss of their homes. Parents are challenged to find employment that provides income that will put a roof over their heads and food for their family. As we serve at the shelter, we see the negative effects on children created by unstable living situations. When a family loses their home, it is a loss that effects everyone. A home embodies an intangible feeling of familiarity and security that goes beyond four walls.

To add stability to these young lives, the Christian Shelter developed a "child mentoring program," and we are fortunate to have Casey Flanagan and two additional youth mentors who are very caring and responsible. When children arrive at the shelter, they are usually distant and not talkative. At the beginning of each session, a child will be asked "how was school today?" Games, crafts, and activities for each age group keep their minds active. Gradually the children begin talking more, smiles begin to appear, hugs are given to the mentors, and a noticeable change in behavior becomes evident as children begin experiencing the stability found at the Christian Shelter. Casey Flanagan easily connects with children, and her warm and welcoming personality draws children to her. Relationships with the youth are a direct result of the mentoring

sessions and are most meaningful to Casey and others who work in this program. The team of Casey Flanagan, Stacey Townsend, and Akela Moales work well together, sharing their ideas and bringing their skills and life experiences to the program.

Casey says, "It's so powerful and quite humbling when you realize the impact you're having on their lives". The "child mentoring program" is making a difference in the lives of children staying at Christian Shelter.
